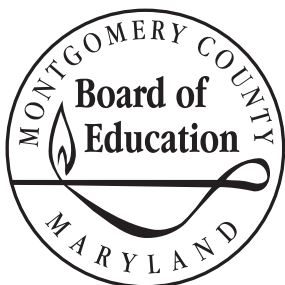

1. Registration forms must be fully completed and all signatures must be obtained before forms can be processed. **Students will not be allowed to register**

for summer school without a completed registration form and appropriate payment.

2. Registration forms (MCPS Form 325-5HS) may be obtained from any Montgomery County public school or online at: www.montgomeryschoolsmd.org/departments/extendedhours/summerschool.

3. **Students must register for all regional summer school courses at the locations and times listed below. They do not have to register at the location where they will be taking classes.**

4. Mailed or faxed registrations will **NOT** be processed.

5. No confirmations will be sent. Students should start attending on the first day of class. Students will be notified only if their class is canceled.

General Information

Resident/Nonresident Students: A resident is a student residing year-round in Montgomery County, or whose parent or legal guardian is a county resident.

A nonresident is a student whose home school and parent or legal guardian are outside Montgomery County.

International students attending non-U.S. schools and not registered with the MCPS International Student Admissions Office are not eligible to enroll in the program.

Tuition: Full payment of tuition is required for all students at the time of registration. Costs are listed with the description of each program.

Checks or money orders should be made payable to MCPS (Montgomery County Public Schools). Checks must be preprinted with name and address. Please include the student's name and MCPS ID number in the memo portion of the check. Checks drawn on foreign banks will not be accepted.

To pay by credit /debit card (VISA or MasterCard only), complete and sign the credit card information box on the Summer School Registration form.

Attendance: More than one unexcused absence may disqualify a student from receiving HS credit. The highly concentrated programs offered in the HS summer school sessions make full-time attendance necessary. Explanatory notes from parents will be required for absences and tardiness, and all cases will be subject to verification by the summer school site office.

Cancellation of Courses: Classes that do not meet enrollment requirements will be canceled. Students will be notified if their class is canceled and given the opportunity to switch to another class and/or location or to get a refund.

Change of Course/Location or Refund: Refunds will be made only if a student's class is canceled because of insufficient enrollment, or to students who have never attended class. One day's attendance makes the student ineligible for a full refund. An exception is made for the student who attends less than one week and must withdraw because of (1) hospitalization or (2) home confinement for personal illness. Refunds are automatically issued for courses that have been canceled. All other requests for refunds must be submitted in writing to the Regional Summer School Refund Office (CESC, 850 Hungerford Drive, Room 170, Rockville, Maryland 20850) on or before the last day of summer school (August 6, 2009). Each request must include the student's name, MCPS ID number, the summer school course, location, and reason for withdrawal. Refunds will be processed within a month following receipt of a written request. Check refunds will take approximately 4 to 6 weeks.

Discipline: Students are expected to comply with all rules and regulations of MCPS and their summer school center.

Clearance: Before students can receive their grades, all fees must be paid and all books and materials loaned to them for the summer session must be returned to the appropriate teachers.

Transportation: Parents are responsible for providing transportation for their students to the summer school centers..

Medical Information: It is your responsibility to notify the summer school center of any important medical information that may pertain to your student.

Accommodations: On the first day of class, parents and/or legal guardians should provide the summer school site administrator with a copy of the accommodations included on the student's Individual Education Plan (IEP) or 504 Plan (if applicable).

Additional Information for High School Students

Class Schedule: 8:10 a.m.–1:00 p.m. daily

Student Information: All students must plan their summer school program through the counseling department of their home school. A counselor's is required on the registration form in order for it to be processed.

Tuition: Refer to individual course listings for tuition information.

Eligible Students: The high school summer school is planned for students who are presently enrolled in Grades 9–12. Students who have completed Grade 8 may take a credit course with the recommendation of their home school principal and the approval of their receiving high school's principal (or designee). Careful planning is critical to the high school program. Graduates may return for postgraduate courses during the summer immediately following their graduation in June.

Cancellation of Courses: Classes that do not meet enrollment requirements will be canceled. Students will be notified if their class is canceled and given the opportunity to switch to another class and/or location or to get a refund.

Loss of Credit—Grades 9–12: Course credit may not be given if a student has more than one unexcused absence during a summer school semester.

Final Examinations—Grades 9–12: Final exams will be given in accordance with Board of Education policy.

Report Cards: Report cards will be issued for all students at the end of the course. These report cards will be mailed to the students' homes. Grades are electronically uploaded onto student records for MCPS students; therefore, transcripts are not required. Students who require a transcript sent to a non-MCPS school must provide the teacher with a stamped envelope addressed to that school.

Graduation Information: Graduation information packets, including forms, will be available from the summer school site secretary. MCPS students planning to graduate upon successful completion of summer school need to submit selected forms to the summer school site secretary no later than Monday, July 27, 2009.

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A Special Education Program

The program listed below is offered in the summer to promote and enrich social/emotional growth and learning for students with disabilities. Transportation is provided, but can only be assured if registrations are received by May 23. Please refer to the individual program offerings listed below for specific registration information.

Project Discovery: Physically Disabled, Grades K–12 0435

Project Discovery is cosponsored by MCPS and the Department of Recreation (MCRD). This program is designed for students whose primary disability is physical and who generally demonstrate average cognitive ability. The program includes activities such as creative arts, music, nature study, and adaptive physical education (including swimming).

Occupational and physical therapists, speech pathologists, and

volunteers from the recreation department provide support to the program. The program capacity is 30 students.

ESOL

(English for Speakers of Other Languages)

ESOL classes will be held at the Regional Summer School sites. Registrations are to be completed through the ESOL Resource Teachers and ESOL counselors at each school. Please contact your school for registration and waiver forms. **ESOL registrations must be signed by the ESOL Resource Teacher at the student's home school.**

Students in ESOL Levels 1 and 2 will use basic texts and materials to develop listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills in English. Students in Levels 3, 4, and 5 will learn and further develop language structures and syntax within the context of literary and expository text.

To enroll in this program, a student must be—

1. a resident of Montgomery County;
2. enrolled in a regular ESOL class prior to the beginning of summer school, and be recommended by the ESOL teacher and/or ESOL resource teacher whose signature will be required on the student registration form;
3. in need of summer school according to ESOL program criteria as follows:
 - a. ESOL Level 1 or 2, if in high school and recommended by the ESOL teacher (see note above). ESOL 3, 4, 5 with prior approval of ESOL resource teacher;
 - b. current eighth graders must have their ESOL teacher's approval before registering for the high school ESOL classes;
4. registered with the MCPS International Student Admissions Office (if considered a foreign student), located at Rocking Horse Road Center, 4910 Macon Road, Rockville, Maryland 20852, telephone 301-230-0686;
5. recommended by the ESOL Testing Center for summer school classes (after the last day of classes for students) or meet other criteria for admittance, as designated by the Division of ESOL/Bilingual Programs.

Advanced Painting and Portfolio Development 6313/6314

1.0 credit

Tuition: \$350

Laboratory Fee: \$40 (to be paid on the first day of class)

This four-week course at the MCPS Visual Art Center at Albert Einstein High School will focus on advanced individual painting exploration and portfolio development for college applications, scholarship competition, and the Advanced Placement Studio Art Exam. The students will be assigned some complex visual tasks and given the opportunity to begin to develop a unique body of work for their portfolios.

e-Learning

The e-Learning program provides students with opportunities to obtain high school credit through internet-based courses. These courses are taught by highly qualified MCPS teachers who conduct classes, give assignments, answer questions, lead discussions, enter grades, and communicate course content and student progress to parents. Every MCPS online course requires a number of face-to-face sessions which students must attend in order to receive credit in the course. 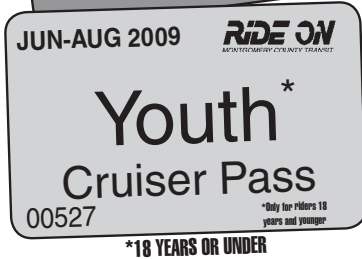
